Can I take this opportunity to congratulate all our children who have started in Reception. Can we also welcome the new families linked to Reception, some of whom are linked with St John's for the first time and also it is great to see many familiar families continuing their link with the school as their younger children also join us.

Ofsted Inspection:

Hopefully, you will have received a copy of the report from our recent Ofsted inspection. We are extremely pleased that recognition has been given for the excellent provision, wide range of opportunities and that St. John's '...is a happy and vibrant place for pupils to learn and thrive'. None of this is possible without the hard work and commitment that the teachers, teaching assistants,



support staff, governors, parents and most importantly the children put in to make St. John's '.....the heart and soul of the community.' We therefore would like to thank you for the highly positive feedback, your ongoing support and reassure you that we will continue to strive to develop and improve the school and feel confident that St. John's will continue to go from strength to strength.



Whilst overall we firmly believe that the entire school community has responded extremely well to the challenges of the pandemic, we feel it is important that we plan for the 'intentional recovery of the school'. Therefore, the areas for development during this academic year are very much related to re-establishing and enhancing the key aspects of life at St. John's that were affected during the last eighteen months:

- **Key Priority 1:** Reading (including oracy, new phonics scheme, monitoring home reading, development of the school library, approaches to vocabulary development, high quality texts & class readers, oracy, love of reading author visits/reading competitions, embed teaching of reading comprehension skills, etc.)
- **Key Priority 2: Curriculum** (including Meeting our 5 core values, knowledge organisers, identifying & planning to close gaps in core subjects, adapting the curriculum to meet the needs of learners in specific year groups, sharing good practice across and outside school, hooks & celebrations, holding on to what has worked well during the pandemic, e.g. Google Classroom / remote learning, etc., well-being curriculum PSHE, etc.)
- **Key Priority 3: Enriching experiences** (including the lunchtime experience activities, use of the MUGA court, whole school interactions now there are no bubbles, buddy system, trips and visits yearly overview, theme days & weeks, planning for cultural capital, residentials, year group specific enrichment activities forest school, Cello, ECO club, using the community as a resource, e.g. illustrator, gardening, male role models, etc.)

Whilst at present we believe we are able to invite parents in for these, albeit without the rest of the school present, we must keep an eye on the infection rates within school and across Stockport and respond responsibly.

Whole school events:

A big part of St John's is the wider community coming together for whole school celebrations and fundraising events. We are very grateful to the PTA who have already been able to host the first disco of the year and raise much needed funds for school. The event was risk assessed and modified to reflect the current position regarding COVID. Moving forward we will have to carefully monitor the rising infection rates in Stockport before being able to confirm further wider community events.


Supporting School:

Pupil Water Charge:

As in previous years it is necessary to ask for a £5 contribution from each child in order that we can continue to provide children with chilled filtered water throughout the day. This payment is due as soon as possible and is payable via ParentPav.

Children will need to bring a clearly labelled water bottle in each day, or alternatively one can be purchased from school (including our school logo!) for £1.00

St John's Holiday Club - October Half Term:

We are hoping to run our Holiday Club from 25th to 29th October. There will be many activities on offer including baking, cooking, film and book club, games and arts & crafts and we will have full use of the MUGA Court so the children can be outside in the fresh air.

Extra-Curricular Clubs:

Over the last 3 years we have been trying to increase the range and number of clubs on offer at St Johns and we are very grateful to the staff who willingly give up their time to run these clubs for free. We regularly modify our offer based upon the children's interests and the demand which different clubs experience. A letter outlining Teacher Led clubs has been sent out and these clubs are now underway. The Primary Sports Coaches run some of our clubs after school, which are chargeable. Bookings for these must be made via their website.

Contact Details:

Please may we remind all parents of the importance of keeping the emergency contact details that school has up to date. If you are new to the school, have moved or changed phone numbers please ensure school has the new and correct details as soon as possible. Increasingly we are sending text messages to alert parents to important messages and events and therefore without a working mobile number, information could be missed.

Residentials:

PGL (Monday 9^{th} to Friday 13^{th} March) is for Year 5 and 6 and has been booked for the 54 children who returned deposits before the summer break. The next payment for PGL was due by Monday 13^{th} September and is £65, with the final outstanding payment due by 10^{th} January.

With regards to Nantglyn, the residential for Year 3 and 4, sadly after a very uncertain past two years, the residential provider, Education Away, have taken the difficult decision to cease providing residential holidays for schools. Personally, having taken children to Plas Nantglyn for the last twenty-three years, this is a real shame. We will of course look into alternative locations and providers; however, we want to be certain that the venues and provision meets are needs, especially bearing in mind the age of the children attending and the fact that often these children are staying away from home for the first time. Miss Wyatt and myself will keep you informed.

Young Voices 2022:

Young Voices is the largest school choir organiser in the world and organises over 14 capacity concerts a year in the UK & Ireland's leading Arenas. St John's will continue to be part of this fantastic national project and we are offering the opportunity for children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 to join in this wonderful event. The children gain a tremendous amount of musical listening and performance skills but most of all will be able to enjoy singing with thousands of children. This year's Young Voices concert is taking place at Manchester Arena on Tuesday 8th February 2022. Thank you to those who have already confirmed their child's involvement. Should your child

be interested, please let us know as soon as possible so we can register our numbers of children participating in the event.

Home School Agreement:

We firmly believe that in order to secure the best outcomes for our children we need to work in partnership. Baring this in mind we continue to use a St. John's Home School Agreement. We recently asked that you read this agreement, discuss it with your child and return a signed copy to your child's class teacher. If you haven't already done so, please return the signed agreement and return it to school.

Children with Medical Needs:

We support and welcome pupils with medical conditions. If your child has asthma please inform school and provide an inhaler and spacer to be used if needed. If your child requires other medication please discuss this with the school office and complete relevant forms. The school office monitors expiry dates and will contact parents where replacements are due.

Attendance:

Although understandably affected by the pandemic, monitoring of the school's attendance last year indicates that the whole school community continues to have very positive attitudes towards ensuring children are in school, on time and ready to

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learn. The clear link between positive attitudes to punctuality and attendance and outcomes for children are well documented and we will continue to reward all children who have excellent attendance.

Can we politely remind you of Department for Education regulations, which state that "headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances." https://www.gov.uk/school-attendance-absence/overview

and you may receive an education penalty notice or fine of £60 per parent, per child if a child is taken out of school for holidays or other unauthorised reasons

School Uniform

We are very pleased to report that most children have returned to school looking very smart in their school uniforms. Please can we remind parents/ carers that children should also have black, flat shoes (not trainers or boots please) that are comfortable and appropriate for school. All children are expected to wear their uniform every day for school except on non-uniform days. It's really important that all items are clearly labelled to enable us to return them to their owner if they are lost. Please check labels regularly to ensure they can still be read. You can buy name labels from many online providers at very reasonable prices. Jewellery, other than stud earrings and watches, must not be worn in school. Thank you to all those parents who support us with this school rule.

P.E. and Sports

As part of the curriculum each class has 2 P.E. sessions every week. This may be gymnastics, dance, outdoor games or swimming. Please make sure that your child has their labelled P.E. kit in school every day. We expect all children to have an appropriate kit. See the school website if you are unsure of the kit needed.

Parental Engagement:

As a school that wants to provide the best for all its stakeholders, we are constantly looking to seek the opinions and views of our parental community. We are looking to continue our 'Parent Forum' meetings as an opportunity for parents to raise questions and issues for the benefit of all children. These meetings are held periodically throughout the year and last for about 1 hour. These meetings are also a great opportunity to meet other parents and some of the school staff. In a change to previous years, the first of these meetings will be Monday 18th October at 7.00pm as part of the PTA Annual General Meeting (AGM). An opportunity to meet the members of the PTA as well as the parental community of the school.
