



Rebuild of the School:

As you are hopefully aware, the rebuild of the school is progressing with plans to revert back to build on the current site now being the preferred option to explore. I am sure that you are as keen as we are for progress to be made with rebuilding the school. Can we reassure you that the leadership of the school (including the Governors and Senior Leadership) are doing everything in our power to support this process and hopefully move it forward. We will of course look to keep you posted of developments as and when we can.

Progress with our Key Priorities:

Can we take this opportunity to remind you of our key priorities for development this year:



- Key Priority 2: To use a range of strategies to raise boys attainment across all core subjects in order to close the gap between boys and girls achievement
- Key Priority 3: To embed practices to further develop growth mindsets in children and the wider school community.

Hopefully you are aware of a considerable number of developments introduced to address our identified priorities. These include:



- World Maths Day themed around reasoning and problem solving
- Maths tuition for identified Year 6 children
- Introduction of Number Gym both as a teaching resource and home engagement tool
- Significant developments to engage boys in reading 'Bug Club', Boys reading club, purchase of boy friendly books
- Boy friendly writing opportunities planned and delivered
- Introduction of 'St. John's Learning Behaviours: theme day, characters introduced and shared with children and parents, weekly celebration based on chosen half termly behaviour

Next steps include:



- Continue to develop teaching and learning of maths to support reasoning and problem solving skills
- Assemblies and presentations by male role models on how reading & writing supports them in their career
- Introduction of a 'Learning Behaviours' reward system to support marking and feedback




- Year 4 Mr Middlebrough will be teaching Year 4 for an additional day and Miss Lofthouse will be teaching Year 4 two days a week. Miss Lofthouse has agreed to attend our Year 3 & Year 4 residential in April to support getting to know the children in Year4.
- Year 5 Mr Dunn has successfully been recruited to teach Year 5 form May until the end of the academic year. Mr Dunn has worked on supply throughout the school and has built very effective relationships with both children and staff.

I am sure you will join us in welcoming both Mr Dunn and Miss Lofthouse to St. John's.

Safeguarding:

- Attendance and Punctuality Recent monitoring demonstrates that whilst overall school attendance rates are good (96.7%) they have fallen since October 2016 (97.7%). In addition, we are increasingly concerned with the punctuality of some families. Consistently arriving late to school very clearly has a detrimental impact on children's learning and general well being. We would strongly encourage these families to make the necessary adjustments to morning routines to ensure that all children are not affected by arriving to school late. For clarification the school day begins at 8.45am with registration closing at 8.55am. As a school we have been advised to mark lateness as unauthorised, which could then lead to the issuing of an Educational Penalty Notice (EPN) where lateness becomes a real concern.
- Supervision before school We have become aware that some children are being dropped off at the school gate and are left unsupervised. This has led to concerns regarding both keeping children safe and a number of behaviour incidents that have been reported. Can we remind you that supervision from the school begins at



• Local Residents & Road Safety - Local residents continue to express their frustrations and concerns regarding parking, road safety and the speed of traffic. Please can we remind everyone to park, drive and behave in a responsible manner. Can we also ask that you ensure that all children take great care when crossing local roads. We are very much concerned that some children are putting themselves at risk and would greatly appreciate your co-operation in working with the school and local residents in keeping all members of our community safe and happy.

If you are new to the school, have moved or changed phone numbers please ensure school has the new and correct details as soon as possible. Increasingly we are sending text messages to alert parents to important messages and events and therefore without a working mobile number, information could be missed.

The next Parent View Meeting is planned for Friday 24th March, after Family Assembly. We will be looking at the evaluation of the recent parental questionnaire and are very keen to gain the views of parents and hope that the timing of this meeting will encourage those parents who attend the assembly to join us for a cup of tea or coffee and a chance to express your views on how to further develop St. John's.
