## **Rebuild of the School:**

Good news! Progress with planning for the rebuild of St. John's continues with the contractual issues between the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA), the building contractor (Eric Wright Construction) and Stockport MBC now resolved. The ESFA, who are responsible for the oversight and management of the project, have instructed the contractor to engage with the school in the design process. You may well have noticed that there have been site investigations being carried out in school. These investigations are to inform the design and layout of the rebuilt school. Next steps include completion of site investigations and the continuation of the design process. This can hopefully lead, subject to planning, to the build process beginning mid summer 2018. I will look to keep you informed of significant developments as we progress with the process.


## Learning at St. John's:

Not the real kids, of course, but the author of this brilliant new fantasy adventure series, Mike Gleason, and his illustrator, Victoria Taylor (a close relative of one of our families!), will be making a visit to the school. *Hideout Kids* books tell stories of ten-year old Sheriff Tuff Brunson and his best friend ten-year old Deputy Sadie Marcus. Tuff and Sadie work for a powerful good witch, Judge "June" Beak, in a mysterious town where only children can live and adults can't find. They bring outlaws to justice and keep order throughout the Wild West and points beyond, helped by a happy group of talking animals including Wild Thing, a pink fairy armadillo, and Mr. Zip, a polite beaver.

These are wonderful books, beautifully illustrated, which I'm sure the children will enjoy reading. Mike and Victoria will share some of their secrets behind the creation of the books and keep the children laughing and engaged with a discussion of "behind the scenes" action.

Author visits are always enhaged if the childpon have rset of series book or two beforehand. They'll know the

## **Communication:**

- **Issues receiving texts or emails via ParentPay** A text was sent out recently regarding changing your email address or mobile number. Any changes are required to be completed on ParentPay, through the edit account details. This ensures that your personal account data is only visible to yourself. The message will always go out to priority contact 1 as indicated on the Pupil Information Pack completed on admission to the school. We will only send paper copies of letters if we require a reply giving consent for trips or permission to attend events.
- **Contact Details** Please may we remind all parents of the importance of keeping the emergency contact details that school has up to date. If you are new to the school, have moved or changed phone numbers please ensure school has the new and correct details as soon as possible. Increasingly we are sending text messages to alert parents to important messages and events and therefore without a working mobile number, information could be missed.
- WhatsApp We are increasingly aware of queries regarding school being discussed through WhatsApp groups. This has on occasion led to inaccurate information being circulated. As always, if you have any concerns or queries we would encourage you to contact school so that these can be dealt with.
