ATTENDANCE

As you know we actively encourage positive attitudes to attendance and punctuality at St. John's

through monitoring and celebrating high standards of attendance. We have worked very hard this year on improving our attendance target and so far 170 children have reached 95% attendance. Well done to all those children and parents who have helped us reach this! All children who achieve 100% attendance for this term will receive a 'St. John's attendance pencil and ruler' in our end of year achievement assembly. Those who achieve 100% attendance for the whole school year will also receive a 'St. John's 100% attendance medal!'

Unfortunately, we have had a significant number of requests for leave of absence for family holidays recently. Regulations are clear that the headteacher is only allowed to authorise requests for leave of absence in exceptional circumstances, which does not include holidays. In addition, any request for leave of absence beyond five days cannot be approved. Unauthorised absences may be issued with an education penalty notice (EPN). Can we also take this chance to emphasise the need to instil positive attitudes towards punctuality in our children. Children should meet their classes on the playground no later than 8.45am. Families should not be using the main entrance as a daily entrance for school. This prevents the office staff from being available to support parents and carers with enquiries.

TESCO GROUNDWORK PROIECT:

We are looking to develop the grounds, our outdoor learning and purchase new equipment for use outdoors from the money raised. We have been selected as one of the three finalists for store voting for the Tesco Groundwork Project. People vote via a blue coin, collected on payment at checkouts. The money received has been raised through the 5p bag charge and other Tesco community projects. We do hope you can support us by voting for us at your local Tesco store.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

This year school has made a concerted effort to ensure all children and families are very clear on our policy regarding school uniform and we would like to thank all the families that have worked in partnership with the school to ensure their child arrives at school in the correct uniform, which includes no trainers, nail varnish or elaborate jewellery or accessories. We would like to reinforce that in order to bring a fair and consistent approach to all children, in September we will pursue our approach to children wearing the correct school uniform and will ask children wearing items that are not part of the whole school policy to remove them. We acknowledge that occasionally there may be a short term issue but ask that as always you speak to your child's class teacher.
