PARKING CONCERNS:

Unfortunately we have had a number of occasions where local residents and parents within our community have reported aggressive behaviour related to frustrations over parking. Although these trips are expensive the benefits for the children are always very obvious and the time away always features as one of the highlights of the children's primary school time. FOREST SCHOOLS:

As you may have noticed we have begun the process of developing our Forest School area to support the Forest School provision. Could we ask if anyone knows of any tree surgeons/landscape gardeners that have access to logs they would be willing to donate, that you contact the school office as we still require larger logs to create seating areas for our sessions. Also a polite reminder for parents to prevent their children from going into the Forest School area and sensory garden before and after school as young sapling and plants are being damaged.
