END OF A BUSY BUT SUCCESSFUL YEAR

We are getting ever closer to the end of what has been an incredibly busy but exciting year for the school. We believe we have continued to move the curriculum forward and offer a wide range of engaging opportunities for our pupils whilst also planning for and preparing to move into our new school building in September. We would like to thank everyone for their support over the past year.

Having said this, the school year is not over yet and there are still many fun and exciting oppoprtunties and events still to come.

REBUILD OF THE SCHOOL:

One of the biggest, but most exciting, challenges for the school this year has been preparing for the rebuild. As you have hopefully seen the rebuild has progressed at a rapid rate once a spade was in the ground. We are now at the stage where the painters are currently working insde the building, the internal walls are up and plastered, staircases are in and key items of furniture and ICT have been ordered.

They have had regular interactions with the children, leading assemblies, meeting the school council, delivering workshops for various classes and will hopefully be giving children a tour of the school before the summer holiday. Linked with rebuild has the been the first phase of the Mobile classroom development. As you may have noticed the mobile has had a new insulated roof and the external of the building has been clad. We are delighted with the visual improvements of the mobile but also that it has had a new lease of life. From September onwards it is proposed that the mobile will be used for music lessons, providing a purposeful place for tuition and practice and it is also planned that the mobile will become the new home for the FABS Club.

ATTENDANCE

As you know we actively encourage positive attitudes to attendance and punctuality at St. John's through monitoring and celebrating high standards of attendance. We have worked very hard again this year on improving our attendance rates and so far 184 children have reached 95% attendance. Well done to all those children and parents who have helped us reach this! All children who achieve 100% attendance for this term will receive a 'St. John's attendance pencil and ruler' in our end of year achievement assembly. Those who achieve 100% attendance for the whole school year will also receive a 'St. John's 100% attendance medal!'

Unfortunately, we continue to receive a significant number of requests for leave of absence for family holidays. Regulations are clear that the headteacher is only allowed to authorise requests for leave of absence in exceptional circumstances, which does not include holidays. In addition, any request for leave of absence beyond five days cannot be approved. Unauthorised absences may be issued with an education penalty notice (EPN). Can we also take this chance to emphasise the need to instil positive attitudes towards punctuality in our children. Children should meet their classes on the playground no later than 8.45am.

Families should not be using the main entrance as a daily entrance for school. This prevents the office staff from being available to support parents and carers with enquiries. All children arriving via the main office must be signed in **by an adult** to support us in tracking attendance and punctuality.

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SAFEGUARDING:

We continue to work hard to ensure the safeguarding systems are the best they can be to keep the children at school safe. Could we please give the following reminders which are issues we still have and have the potential to cause worry for children, parents or staff.

- Children should not be left unsupervised in the playground in the morning. School take supervision for your child once the teacher meets their line at 8.45am.
- Please use the pavements around the edge of the turning circle at the end of Poplar Street as some families and children are cutting across the truning circle.
- Should you change your conact details please ensure the school office are made aware of this.
- If your child is being collected by another adult, please ensure school is made aware so we can release children at the end of the day without the need for contacting you to check the arrangments.
- Please do not allow your child to ride their bike/scooter in the school grounds or play ball games at the start and end of the day as at this busy period this has the potential to cause an accident.
- We continue to discourage children from playing rough games at breaks and lunch times as invariably games such as these lead to fallouts or injuries. We would appreciate your support in echoing these messages at home.

Currently the segregation between the building site and school site has worked well and supported keeping everyone safe. When we return in September we will need to ask you to be extra vigilant around school entrances, as during the demolition stage (September to December) the building site will be located in the middle of the school site with children accessing the new building but also the playground. Plans are being prepared to ensure the the children and families arriving and departing school stay safe. We will be in touch with more details nearer the time about how this period will work.

HEALTHY SNACKS:

At St. John's our school policy is that children should only have healthy snacks at morning playtime. There have been a few incidents recently of children bring ing in sweets and chewing gum. Please can we ask that children bring healthy items and refrain from bringing chocolate biscuits, crisps, sweets and fizzy drinks as snacks. **Please help your child to make healthy choices.**

Could we remind all families that we aim to be **nut free** wherever possible due to some of our children and staff having allergies.

FABS (Fun After and Before School Club)

As you may be aware Mrs Greenhalgh who used to manager the FABS Club left us at Easter. We have now appointed a new manager for FABS and are pleased to announce this is Miss Proctor one of our current Teaching Assistants. She has clear ideas about how she would like to continue to develop the club.
