- ✓ Support the activities of the **Parent Teacher Association**
- ✓ Ensure my child's **Uniform** and **PE kit** and other relevant items (e.g. bag) meet the school's policy, are properly labelled and in school every day during term time.
- Support and adhere to all school policies.

- ✓ Build and sustain a close partnership through being open and welcoming at all times, and through offering opportunities for you to become involved in the daily life of our school
- ✓ Keep you closely informed about school activities through regular letters home, our website, newsletters, texts, Twitter and notices about special events

- Provide an exciting, balanced curriculum and meet the individual needs of your child
- Set, monitor and provide feedback on homework as appropriate
- Monitor and discuss your child's achievement through parents' interviews and annual written reports, informing you of your child's effort and what s/he needs to learn and do next
- Let you know promptly about any concerns or problems that affect your child's work or behaviour
- Take all reasonable steps to ensure your pupil is safe (including E-safety)
